## Boys' State Selection Process Important!

Ronald A. Engel, Deputy Director for Americanism/Children & Youth Division in Indianapolis, has issued this word of caution: *Do not let the schools make the delegate selection.* That is the responsibility of the sponsoring American Legion Post. To involve the schools in the selection process sends a message to the Courts that Boys State is a "school activity." When this occurs, Title IX exemptions for Boys State could be eliminated and our programs thrown open to anyone wishing to attend who are willing to pay the delegate fee. Think about the ramifications. There is no better way to assure the survival of our great republic than to train our young people in the ideals and objectives of American government. This is an American Legion Program. Please be active in the process. This year's session will be June 18-24, 2006. The fee will be \$275 per delegate. If you have an interest in serving as a counselor for Boys' State, please contact Chief Counselor Terry Pressley at 828-452-4232. Counselors receive travel expense, food and lodging for the week. You have a chance to work with and see some of the finest rising young seniors in government action.

## Consolidated Post Report

It is important for every post to complete this report because it shows individual post activity, but when it is combined with the efforts of all posts reporting, it makes our impact, on behalf of veterans, in the halls of Congress, a voice to be taken serious. The Consolidated Post Report forms have been mailed directly to the Post Adjutants. Please fill them out and return to Department Headquarters as early as possible. Remember, in order for your Post to be considered for any awards presented by Community Service Committee, Children and Youth Commission or Americanism Commission at the Convention, this form must be completed and returned to Department Headquarters by the end of May.

## ROTC Medals Available

Requests for ROTC medals for deserving cadets will be coming in from schools across the state. Department Headquarters will provide medals for colleges and universities. It is customary for the Posts to supply the medals for the local high schools. You may order direct from Emblem Sales, 2006 Catalog, page 128, for purchase of these medals. Department Headquarters inventory goes directly for colleges and universities. ## Obtaining Records

The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) is the nations memory and record keeper. Part of NARA is the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) in St. Louis MO. They store federal military and civilian personnel records. The Civilian Personnel

Records Center is at 9700 Page Avenue. They have a website at <http://www.nara.gov>.

Their website will provide information on how to obtain records or one can call (314) 538-4261 and get a recorded message on how to obtain records on how to request copies of personnel files. NPRC does not provide a telephone number, which can be used to request records due to the privacy act, which requires a signature of the veteran, next of kin, or authorized representative and staffing limitations at NPRC.

## Baseball Jr. League News

A check made payable to The American Legion Dept. of NC will be submitted to the Director before play begins. The forfeit fees will be retained from season to season like in Sr. American Legion Baseball.
