Amount presented by American Legion Riders onstage at the 102nd National Convention Aug. 31 in support of The American Legion Legacy Scholarship Fund. The Department of Minnesota led the fundraising effort with \$174,000, the fourth straight time it has produced six-digit contributions. More than \$400,000 came in through the 16th Legacy Run, which arrived Aug. 26 in Phoenix. The scholarship fund provides college money for the children of military personnel who lost their lives or became over 50% disabled since Sept. 11, 2001.

"I think many civilians in the country understand that it's difficult to come back from serving, but I don't think many understand the depths of that. For myself, it was a big education. And then to be able to do the PSA and help get that word out to everyone else has been really impactful and certainly something we need to correct.
