## Obtaining Records

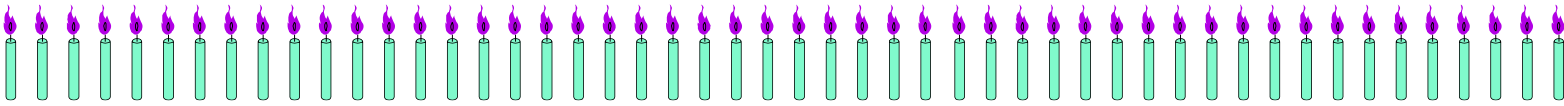
The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) is the nation's memory and record keeper. Part of NARA is the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) in St. Louis MO. They store federal military and civilian personnel records. The Civilian Personnel Records Center is at 9700 Page Avenue. They have a website at <http://www.nara.gov>. Their website will provide information on how to obtain records or one can call (314) 538-4261 and get a recorded message on how to obtain records on how to request copies of personnel files. NPRC does not provide a telephone number, which can be used to request records due to the privacy act, which requires a signature of the veteran, next of kin, or authorized representative and staffing limitations at NPRC.

## Patriotic School Award

Included with this mailing is the nomination form for the new Patriotic The intent is to recognize public, private, charter, parochial, magnet or military K-12 schools located in North Carolina that has promoted patriotism and patriotic education in their school during the school year. There will be 1 award in each category, elementary, middle and high school, for a total of 3 awards. The school must be nominated by a chartered Post of The American Legion Department of NC. Awards will be selected at the June Convention and presented at the Fall Conference in October. Please submit your nominations by May 15, 2023.

The tuition fee is still \$200.00 per student and each applicant must be sponsored by an American Legion Post. The Highway Patrol has room for up to 40 students this year, so please send in your applications as soon as possible. All applications will be numbered when received and all applications received past number 40 will be on a standby list. We encourage you to take advantage of the special youth program and to provide a once in a lifetime opportunity to some well deserving young men and women. ### Boys' State Selection Process Important!

Americanism/Children & Youth Division in Indianapolis, has issued this word of caution: ***Do not let the schools make the delegate selection.*** That is the responsibility of the sponsoring American Legion Post. To involve the schools in the selection process sends a message to the Courts that Boys State is a "school activity." When this occurs, Title IX exemptions for Boys State could be eliminated and our programs thrown open to anyone wishing to attend who are willing to pay the delegate fee. This is an American Legion Program. Please be active in the process. This year's session will be June 18-24, 2023. The fee will be \$500 per delegate. If you have an interest in serving as a counselor for Boys' State, please contact Chief Counselor Terry Pressley at 828-452-4232. Counselors receive travel expense, food and lodging for the week. You have a chance to work with and see some of the finest young men in government action.

### Post Yearbook Award

The Department of North Carolina will hold a contest for One-Year Post Scrapbook/Yearbooks for the 2022-2023 Legion year. The scrapbooks will be judged at the Department Convention held in June by the Public Relations Committee appointed by the Department Commander.
