About Us

Founded in 1938 and sponsored by the American Legion, a veterans service organization, nearly every state hosts a Boys State program for the best and brightest of the state's rising high school seniors. This civically oriented leadership camp is designed to develop the delegate's understanding of state and local government and inculcate a shared responsibility of citizenship through a challenging simulation of government.

Tar Heel Boys State (THBS) is an immersive, weeklong program where students learn by doing:

Upon arrival, newly sworn-in delegates are set to work establishing a city, a county, and, by the end of the week, a statewide government that writes, debates, and votes on legislation that will impact millions of citizens.

Delegates to Tar Heel Boys State will have the opportunity to participate in our nationally recognized Moot Court program. After attending a lecture facilitated by a practicing attorney, delegates will take a THBS Bar Exam based on real questions from the North Carolina Bar. If they pass, delegates will have the opportunity to establish law firms and file lawsuits against each other and the government of THBS.

Our goal is to provide the best and brightest future leaders of North Carolina with the civic education and leadership training they need to make a positive difference in their community, North Carolina, and our great nation.



Grow Leadership Skills

Whether running a THBS session, acting in their elected capacity, or attending our leadership series throughout the week, delegates have several ways to grow their leadership skills to bring back to their communities to make an impactful difference.



Guest Speakers

Throughout the week delegates have the opportunity to hear from prestigious guest speakers such as senators, judges, and elected public officials. At the end of their lectures, delegates are offered the opportunity to ask questions and engage with the speakers.

After the campaign and election process, delegates get hands-on experience practicing what we call government in action. During these sessions, delegates must solve real-world scenarios faced by public officials and must work together in their capacities to run their 51st state.
